Save-A-Pet Animal Rescue was founded in 1994. Our concern for the devastatingly large surplus of domestic animals sowed the seeds for our ever growing shelter. Under the direction of Dori Scofield, the dedicated staff, volunteers and local veterinarians have made Save-A-Pet a safe harbor for companion animals.

As a no-kill facility, we care for dogs and cats until they find new homes, no matter how long it takes. All of our animals are spayed and neutered, vaccinated and tested for diseases. Prospective adopters are screened and matched with the pet most suitable for them and their families.

Mission Statement

At Save-A-Pet we believe it is our moral responsibility to protect and improve the lives of abused, abandoned and homeless animals, and to place them in loving, permanent homes. We provide spay and neuter services and any necessary medical care. We work diligently to educate the public, especially children on the importance of pet sterilization and responsible pet ownership.



Programs

Animal Rescue

Save-A-Pet has rescued thousands of animals from suffering and untimely deaths and placed them in loving homes, where they receive a new start in life. Save-A-Pet is not subsidized by any person or organization and depends solely on donations to continue its work.

Adoption

There are many types of dogs and cats to choose from, and the staff gets to know each and every one of them. This makes it easier to make a lifelong match between pet and owner. Our animals are used to a home-like setting.

Prospective adopters are thoroughly screened and matched with the most suitable pet for them and their family. Feral Trap, Neuter Return Program

Save-A-Pet is committed to a feral trap, neuter and return program. This program is dedicated to the responsible care of unsocialized cats living outside. They are trapped and brought to our clinic for spaying/neutering, vaccines and testing for diseases. This is done with the understanding that food and shelter will be provided by their benefactors.

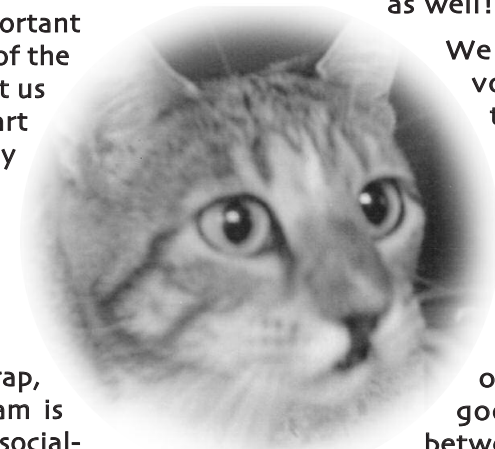
Donate
